JRC Reports and Notes

JRC Reference Reports

- A JRC Reference Report is a scientific/technical report in support of EU policy-making issued by the JRC that is likely to be used, at high level, as a source of reference in policy or scientific arenas outside the JRC. Examples include reference in the press, the European Parliament, Council or in policy discussions at the level of Commissioner or Director General or in high level scientific fora. A JRC Reference Report might include, for example, technical specifications or analyses to be used as support to EU policy, assessments of the options for EU policy-making or assessments of compliance with current EU policy.

JRC Scientific and Technical Reports

- Scientific and technical reports, usually written as deliverables of the JRC Work Programme for a specific customer, e.g. another Commission DG or another national or international institution, or the public in general.

JRC Technical Notes

- Procedural guidelines for laboratories and all types of provisional documents elaborated in the context of on-going projects, technical proposals, project status reports etc.
